

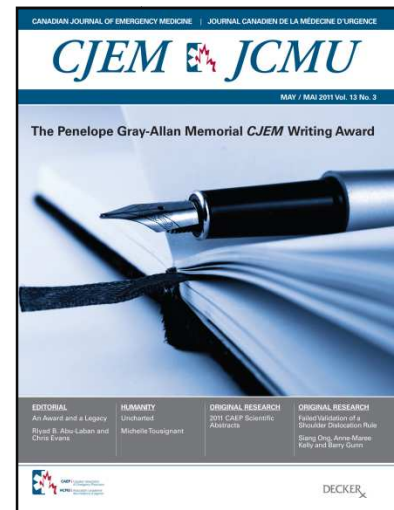


Canadian Journal of Emergency Medicine Receives Debut Impact Factor and Top 10 Ranking

July 11, 2011—Decker Publishing is thrilled to announce that *Canadian Journal of Emergency Medicine (CJEM)* received a debut impact factor of 1.515 in 2011, according to the Thomson Reuters Journal Citation Reports®. The journal is ranked 10 of 23 in the Emergency Medicine category. The impact factor and ranking are based on 2010 performance.

Thomson Reuters measures a journal's "impact" or significance based on the number of article citations compared to the total number of articles published. The impact factor—a quantitative measure of the frequency with which an article in a journal is cited—is used to gauge the overall influence of a journal within the scientific, professional and academic communities.

Published bimonthly and led by Editor in Chief James Ducharme, MD, *CJEM* is Canada's only academic journal in emergency medicine. The journal publishes articles of interest to emergency care providers in rural, urban or academic settings that reflect the growing interest in emergency medicine, both as a medical discipline and an expanding field for research.
